BATCH FARROWING WITH MODERN GENETICS AND LARGER LITTERS

There appears to be more interest today in the practice of "batch farrowing." What is batch farrowing? Batch farrowing is the adjustment of pig flow to make up bigger groups of pigs every three weeks, compared to producing smaller groups every week. The main benefits of this system are:

- improved health
- faster growth over time
- improved feed efficiency
- increased livability
- reduced medication costs

Batch farrowing also enables skills and effort to be concentrated at critical times, such as service and farrowing.

As with all trade-offs, there are disadvantages as well. Some of them include:

- 1) Breeding herd management has to be of a very high standard to maintain an even pig flow.
- Gilts and "stale" sows can fail to cycle within the required period, meaning that extra females need to be mated to avoid empty crates.
- 3) Less flexibility with using nurse sows as they are not always available.

Let's take a look at this latter factor more closely in conjunction with modern genetics and larger litters. When nurse sows are not as readily available, it is more important that each sow has the necessary attention and help to get her and her pigs off to a great start. This enables her to rear as many quality pigs as possible. With batch farrowing and larger litters, there typically tends to be more fall-behind and/or starve-out pigs, which can lead to higher pre-weaning mortality.

Production data is for six-month periods: before (without), partially with, and with Supp-Le-Milk.
